WORLD DAY FOR CONSECRATED LIFE February 2nd

In 1996 Pope John Paul II established this observance on February 2 (the Feast of Presentation of the Lord in the Temple) for the whole Church. The purpose of the day is "to help the entire Church to esteem ever more greatly the witness of those persons who have chosen to follow Christ by means of the practice of the evangelical counsels" as well as "to be a suitable occasion for consecrated persons to renew their commitment and rekindle the fervour which should inspire their offering of themselves to the Lord."

In the second reading of this Sunday, St. Paul says, "The unmarried man is anxious about the affairs of the Lord, how to please the Lord....The unmarried woman and the virgin are concerned about the affairs of the Lord, so that they may be holy in body and in spirit..." (1Cor 7:32-35).

Fr. Philip's

It's not easy to talk about authority today. The whole notion seems quaintly out of fashion. We're very aware of how badly authority has been used in the past: repressive parents, iron-fisted governments, overly-strict boarding schools, and burning heretics are just a few of the nightmare images which the term 'authority' evokes. So how does one speak of the authority of Christ and of the Church in such an atmosphere?

In the not-too-distant past, Catholics generally felt secure in the knowledge that God's will (for our belief and conduct) is infallibly explained by the Pope and the bishops, using the teaching authority given them by Christ himself. Influenced (perhaps too profoundly) by the doctrine of papal infallibility, our Catholic Church so strongly upheld the principle of authority, that some people felt inhibited from making up their own mind on any important issue. Whenever controversy arose - there was always a strong statement from the Magisterium (the teaching of the Church), to put the issue beyond doubt.

More recently, we have experienced a devaluation of institutional authority in the Church; some welcome this as a greater freedom for individual conscience, as other Christian denominations enjoy; while others deplore it and long for a return to the hard, clean-cut edge of dogma, defined and unquestionable.

Many times our papers report religious scandals. Charismatic TV preachers, Roman Catholic bishops and priests, caught acting in the immoral ways. The message that they had been delivering from their pulpits for years was true. Many people were moved to come closer to God. Many people confronted their own demons and took steps to draw closer to Christ. But then the scandal hit the papers. The message of the preacher that had moved them was still true, but now it has lost much of its impact. The one who delivered it was not true to his own words. As a result his credibility, his authority was terribly damaged if not totally destroyed.

You can certainly see how this can happen in your home too. Parents have authority due to their position in the family. God tells children to honor their mothers and fathers. That's the Fourth

Commandment. But the authority of parents is diminished or even destroyed when the parents act in ways that are not Christian. For example, all parents want their children to be kind to each other. But if their children observe Mom and Dad being nasty to each other, the children are going to learn nastiness, not kindness, as standard way of acting. When these same parents say to their children that they should be kind to each other, the children respond with their actions as though their parents no longer have authority to tell them how to behave.

That's negative. Let's look at the positive. Many of our seniors have spent years taking care of their sick spouses. Retirement was not what they expected. Instead of going and doing, their days were spent caring and cleaning, and organizing doctor appointments. But when someone makes a comment that he or she is such a good spouse, the caring spouse merely says, "I took vows." And in those few words supported with a lifetime of action, that husband or wife speaks more eloquently about marriage than any priest or preacher could possibly speak. For his or her words have authority, the authority of the One who called them to the sacrament of marriage and the authority of the spouse who lives the sacrament of marriage.

Perhaps we can get some light from today's Gospel, where Jesus 'teaches with authority, and not as their scribes'. It's essential that we refuse to accept that Christ's authority is something like that of a feudal dictator. In fact, if we want to think of a dictator, then we must think of Christ as very nearly the opposite. We could well picture a little procession of a dictator through the town, flanked by a guard of knights, with peasants bowing and scraping and noble ladies curtsying ... but Jesus processes through the streets, guarded by soldiers, carrying a cross, and being abused by most people who bother to take notice.

Jesus backs his teaching authority by his life of love, sacrifice and service. The Church and everyone of us have to do the same if we want the message of Jesus to spread out. We must be resigned to the fact that, for today, the authority of Jesus is weak in the world as many people do not heed his voice anymore, but only for today, tomorrow, with the grace of God and our effort, will be different.

A Voice That Quiets the Chatter

In today's Gospel, Mark tells of Jesus casting out an unclean spirit. Jesus speaks firmly and with great authority, saying, "Quiet. Come out of him." The people marvel that he has an authority that they haven't seen in the scribes and other leaders of the day.

Genuine authority is one of those qualities that's hard to define clearly, but we recognize it when it crosses our path. We might hear it in a teacher, a preacher, a world leader. We might be lucky enough to have had parents or

bosses who possessed it. It comes from a lifetime of hard-earned wisdom. It comes from knowing one's own limits and focusing on one's strengths. Clearly Jesus had it. From the demons to the scatterbrained disciples to the very elements of nature, no chaos is a match for the calm at the center of Jesus' being.

Scholars and lawyers love to argue and debate obscure points of law and construct elaborate arguments to support their own position or score points over their opponents. In the Gospels, when the scribes try to draw Jesus into arguments that were hotly debated by the rabbis, Jesus' sense of authority allows him to cut through the details and see what really needs to be done. In today's Gospel, that one thing is healing the man in front of him.

This academic wrangling becomes more important than the underlying issue being debated. It happens not only in academic circles, but in the media, where raising questions to create a story is a national obsession, and on the Internet, where self-styled authorities answer to no one.

In the first reading, Moses talks about God raising up another prophet to speak the word of the Lord to the people. He knows from his own life that when he let the Lord speak through him, amazing things happened, whereas when he spoke out of his own insecurities or ambitions,

nothing went right. As he gives this speech, in fact, he knows that he will not enter the promised land because he spoke his own words instead of the words God gave him to speak.

We believe that Jesus was the son of God. We know, if his original audience did not, that God was the source of his authority. He spoke the word of God because he was the Word of God. It's as simple as that. But he also taught us that we, too, are the adopted children of God and will do all that he did and more. What will it take for us to believe that we have this kind of authority?

We might begin by relying on others who know us well and care for us and can keep us grounded in who and whose we are. Because sometimes the chattering voices reside in our own heads. We go round and round with ourselves about things that we need to deal with, but we fail to take the one or two clear steps that we know will somehow quiet the chatter and bring us to where we need to be. In our faith lives we are guided by Scripture, by the Church's teachings, by our centuries' old tradition. We can remind ourselves to check what we read or hear against these tried and true authorities. Most importantly, we can call on Jesus in prayer to bring us the peace we need.

In time, we will learn ourselves to say "Enough" and quiet the chatter long enough to act. †
